# **CHERRY BLOSSOM INFO**

Funakoshi Nango Park Cherry Blossom Festival (船越南郷公園桜まつり) A park full of blossoms, to be lit up until 21:00 each night from March 21<sup>st</sup> through April 16<sup>th</sup>! There will be several special events on April 3<sup>rd</sup>, including a parade (10:00, to be cancelled in event of rain), a ceremony (11:30), and entertainment and performances (12:00-15:00).


Where: Funakoshi Nango Park (船越南郷公園)

#### Kinugasa Cherry Blossom Festival (衣笠さくら祭)

A famous traditional place for blossom viewing, chosen as one of Japan's top 100 cherry blossom spots! The trees will be lit up from 18:00-20:00 every night. There will be many special events:



- · Musical and dance performances three times a day on Saturdays and Sundays (11:00, 12:00 and 13:00 on March 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, and April 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>)
- Musical and dance performances on weekdays: 11:00 and 13:00 on March 28th; 11:00 on March 29<sup>th</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup>, and 31<sup>st</sup>, and April 1<sup>st</sup>; 10:00 on April 4<sup>th</sup>

#### Tsukayama Park Cherry Blossom Festival (塚山公園さくら祭)

This park, selected as one of the "50 Views of Kanagawa," commands a spectacular view of nearby ports and cities. A designated national historical site, it also contains the tombs of William Adams and his wife. There is no better time to visit than in spring, when around 1,000 cherry trees are in bloom! Special events will include a parade on March 27<sup>th</sup>, a performance on April 3<sup>rd</sup>, and a talent show on April 8<sup>th</sup>.

#### Kita-kurihama Cherry Blossom Festival (北久里浜桜まつり)



The area surrounding the park will be covered in cherry blossoms! There will be a ceremony on April 2<sup>nd</sup> and performances and a flea market on April 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>. #### Hashirimizu Reservoir Open Week (走水水源地一般開放)

Hashirimizu Reservoir, usually closed to the public, will be opened for cherry blossom peak! The contrast of the delicate blossoms and the bright blue sea is spectacular. Note: Please do not bring pets, flammable substances or any dangerous items; please take your trash home with you.



#### **Bonnie's Corner**

As we move into cherry blossom season, I encourage you to enjoy not only the flowers but also the culture surrounding them! Cherry blossom viewing is just one of many opportunities in Japan culture for appreciating nature in a culturally traditional way. Other seasonal traditions include fall leaf viewings, harvest moon viewings, snow-viewings, and many more—and for each event the feelings you're supposed to experience are clearly defined ahead of time!

Cherry blossoms hold perhaps the highest place of all, however. Sages of old who waxed poetic about cherry blossoms considered them precious because they fall and scatter so quickly. Folks here are disappointed when a storm rolls in and the



season comes to an untimely end, but they're not quite as upset as you might expect—it's precisely the fragility of cherry blossoms that makes them so special. A magnificent cherry blossom season is even more celebrated because it doesn't happen every year.

When you go on *hanami* (blossom viewing), make sure to take advantage of the people-watching opportunities! You'll see lots of people eating and drinking under the cherry trees. In fact, some people see cherry blossom season as a rare excuse to party it up during the day!

There's a famous saying in Japanese, *"hana yori dango,"* which means "dango (sweet mochi balls) are better than blossoms." Or, you might say, enjoying the celebration is at least as important as what you're celebrating, because after all culture is for the people. During cherry blossom season many people who spend most of the year in a rush take the chance to relax a bit.
