Japanese Survival Tips

The September weather in Japan can still be hot and humid, but it is nothing compared to the summer heat experienced in August. Although the temperature will gradually cool down, it is also the time to be on a look out for hurricanes, or also known as typhoons. The typhoon season reaches its peak in late August early September and brings forth strong wind and heavy rain especially along the coast of Japan. It is very important to know what risks your area may have including floods, landslides, and high tides. So, what are some actions you can take to minimize damage?



First, bring any outdoor items inside such as toys, plants, chairs, and tables to prevent any kind of damage to the house. Next, close curtains and window shades to prevent flying glass if windows break. Lastly, have an emergency kit ready!

Although everything has been about typhoons thus far, it does not mean there is nothing to look forward to in September. In Japan, *kouyo* are to autumn as cherry blossoms are to spring. From late September to November, Japan's fall foliage, or *kouyo*, is enjoyed every year by many people and is a great way to spend time outdoors with family and friends!

Another way to enjoy the cool weather is moon-viewing or *tsukimi* which is a festival celebrating the autumn moon. Traditionally, people eat rice dumplings or *Tsukimi dango* while watching the full moon. According to the lunar calendar, full moon is on August 15th but is celebrated on September 13th. As a child, I was told that a rabbit lives in the moon and makes rice dumplings at the time of the full moon!
