SPRING MARKS A NEW BEGINNING

We should soon be expecting the cherry blossoms to bloom, which represent the end of winter and the beginning of a fresh start. For this month, I'll be navigating through the differences between graduation ceremonies in America and Japan, which commence during this time of year.

The biggest difference, of course, is timing. Graduations in America are generally held in May or June while graduations in Japan are held in March. After graduation, students in America enter summer vacation for a good three months, but not in Japan. Because their graduation is in March and their new academic year starts in April, they do not have a long break in between their graduation and entrance ceremony. The next difference between the

two kinds of commencement is the behavior and atmosphere of the graduation ceremony itself. Graduation ceremonies are very serious in Japan, and students are grouped by homeroom class and sit quietly while listening to the speeches from the principal and representatives from the graduating class. Perhaps graduations in the U.S. may have also been serious as the congratulatory speeches were being read, but the ceremony would quickly transform into a roaring football stadium the moment when every student's name is called to receive their hard-earned diplomas. In Japan, because the ceremony takes place in the morning, sometimes on a weekday, most schools only have the immediate family members attend the ceremony; or rather, Japanese people do not have the tradition of inviting distant relatives or friends to graduations.

As mentioned earlier, commencement and entrance ceremonies are both held in the spring when cherry blossoms are in bloom or waiting to bloom. These cherry blossoms symbolize a new beginning like the students, as well as business workers, who are starting a new year refreshed!
