

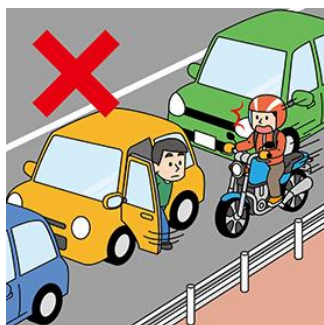
TRAFFIC SAFETY IN YOKOSUKA

1. Characteristics of Accidents in Yokosuka

In Yokosuka, there are many accidents involving older citizens. Please pay special attention when you see elderly people about to cross the street.

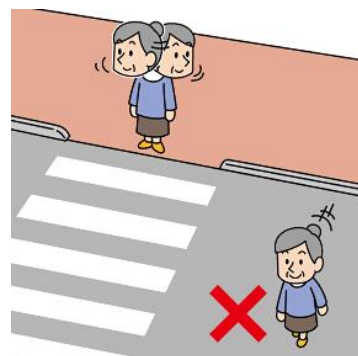


There are many accidents in Yokosuka involving motorcycles and scooters. These vehicles easily disappear in blind spots, so please pay special attention when you see them.

2. Traffic Rules

— Rules for Pedestrians —

When crossing the street, obey pedestrian crossing signals and stay within the crosswalk. When the signal flashes green, it means the same as a yellow light, so you should wait for the next light to cross.



— Rules for bicycles —

Bicycles are classified as “light cars” and belong on the road. Please obey the same traffic signals and signs as cars.

“Five Rules for Bicycle Safety”

- 1 In principle use roadways and ride on the left; only in exceptional cases may sidewalks be used, and give pedestrians right-of-way there

Shared sidewalk



- 2 At intersections, obey traffic signals, be sure to come to a stop, and check safety

- 3 Use your front light at night

- 4 Do not ride under the influence of alcohol

- 5 Wear a bicycle helmet



It's illegal to use a phone while riding.



— Other —

Riding skateboards and other recreational equipment on public roads is prohibited by law. Please use the dedicated skate park at Umikaze Park (Heisei-cho 3-23)
